

Environmental Policy

The Marine Group recognises that many of our business activities and those of our customers have an impact on the environment. It is our aim to minimise this impact through a programme of continuous improvement by promoting best practice, training and building awareness.

The key points of this programme are to:

- Comply with environmental legislation that relates to the company and where possible identify opportunities to adopt best practice over and above the minimum legislative requirements
- ✓ Seek continuous improvement in environmental performance
- Actively encourage all employees to address their environmental responsibilities within the framework of their normal operating practices
- ✓ Work with our tenants and berth holders to raise awareness of their impact on the environment and to help minimise this impact
- ✓ Liaise with the Royal Yachting Association and the British Marine Federation's environmental initiative: The Green Blue
- Encourage berth holders to adopt environmental best practice and supply The Green Blue information upon request
- ✓ Minimise waste by evaluating operations and ensuring they are as efficient as possible
- ✓ Actively promote recycling, both internally and amongst our berth holders through the provision of recycling facilities on our sites
- Develop and distribute appropriate emergency response plans for major incidents to minimise consequent environmental impacts and record and report on all incidents appropriately
- Ensure that our premises are equipped with suitable spill kits to deal with any oil or fuel spills and that staff are trained in how to deal with such situations
- Monitor all environmental impacts on the business, measure our progress and review this policy on an annual basis
